PICP AND THE NEW IAP WEBSITE

The IAP Secretariat have been working on the design and development of a new IAP website over recent months. The website will be more accessible for IAP members, and will have increased functionality to improve your user experience. The website will include a library of written resources and designated pages for each of the IAP Specialist Networks. It will also include your own Members Section, where you can manage all aspects of your membership. The website will be regularly updated with IAP news, including details about forthcoming conferences, webinars, and other Global Training Academy events. We are in the final stages of testing and will announce the launch date as soon as possible.

A significant part of the new website is PICP, the Prosecutors' International Cooperation Platform. One of the main barriers to international cooperation is a lack of knowledge of who to contact in a specific jurisdiction when assistance is needed from them, and the lack of a means to easily establish the requirements for making an informal or formal request for assistance to another country. PICP aims to tackle this challenge as part of the wider drive to enhance the operational effectiveness of the IAP.

PICP will provide a contact database for individual members and prosecuting services. Users of PICP will be able to identify contact points in other jurisdictions with ease, and will be able to communicate in real time via their computer or mobile phone, sending messages and participating in forums. Prosecuting authorities will be invited to register Specialist Contact Persons – prosecutors within their organisation – in relation to a range of specialisms and in relation to the IAP Specialist Networks. They will also be required to register Specialist Contact Persons for MLA, extradition and asset recovery. All individual members can set up a membership profile listing their specialisms, providing a database for users to reach out directly to international partners to progress casework. PICP will therefore create directories of specialist prosecutors in a large number of fields. PICP is primarily a tool to enable members to identify the right person in another organisation to contact, to facilitate that first contact, to progress general enquiries and to establish relationships to progress international casework and other matters of mutual interest.

We strongly encourage all IAP prosecuting authorities and individual members to register their details and specialisms / Specialist Contact Persons on PICP as soon as possible. The success of PICP relies entirely on members uploading their details and keeping them up-to-date and so, in order to make PICP an effective and useful tool for all members, we would be very grateful for your full support in populating the database and in ensuring that the details remain current.





The 29th Annual Conference and General Meeting of IAP, Baku, Azerbaijan 2024

THE 29TH ANNUAL CONFERENCE AND GENERAL MEETING OF THE IAP, BAKU, AZERBAIJAN

The 29th Annual Conference and General Meeting of the IAP will take place in Baku, Azerbaijan, from 29 September - 02 October 2024. The conference will be co-hosted by the Prosecutor General's Office of Azerbaijan.

The theme of the 29th Annual Conference is The Role of the Prosecutor in Upholding the Rule of Law. Criminal justice systems vary considerably from one country to another, but are all underpinned by the need for the fair, impartial and effective administration of justice. The functions of public prosecutors impact on all of those who are involved in a criminal matter, including suspects, defendants, witnesses and victims. Prosecutors must make their decisions independently and carry out their functions objectively, respecting and protecting human rights, and ensuring that the criminal justice system functions in a proper manner. As the crime threats that we face continue to evolve and the complexity of crime increases, prosecutors must ensure that, at every stage in the criminal process, they are upholding the rule of law and acting in the interests of justice.

Against that backdrop, the conference will explore how prosecutors can best ensure that there is procedural equality between the prosecution and defence, and will consider the role that prosecution authorities play as one of the main pillars of an independent criminal justice system. The conference will consider ways in which victims and witnesses can be better served by the criminal justice system to ensure that they are able to give their best evidence, both through specific initiatives and greater collaboration between criminal justice stakeholders. It will examine challenges and responses to the growth in cybercrime and the use of artificial intelligence, carefully considering how prosecutors can ensure transparency and accountability, and will also seek to identify more effective methods of international cooperation to tackle this transnational criminal activity.

Many of the conference themes are mirrored in the IAP Standards of Professional Responsibility and Statement of the Essential Duties and Rights of Prosecutors, which celebrate their 25th anniversary this year.

The Standards – which are as resonant for prosecutors now as they were when they were first issued – will frame the conference discussions and will provide a benchmark for the conduct, roles and responsibilities of prosecutors in upholding the rule of law. Hearing insights from across the globe, we will explore how we can collectively work together to prevent, tackle and combat terrorism, organised crime, and other serious criminal activity.

Plenary 1: National approaches to balancing the three main pillars of an independent

criminal justice system - Challenges and responses

Workshop 1A: The role of the prosecutor in ensuring procedural equality between prosecution

and defence

Workshop 1B: The role of the prosecutor in the sentencing process.

Plenary 2: Victims and witnesses within the criminal justice system

Workshop 2A: Collaboration between stakeholders to ensure the rights of victims in the

criminal justice system

Workshop 2B: Transparency and public confidence in the criminal justice system

Plenary 3: The role of the prosecutor in upholding the rule of law in the digital age -

Challenges and responses

Workshop 3A: Ensuring transparency, accountability and data protection in the framework of

digital evidence and AI usage

Workshop 3B: The importance of international cooperation in prosecuting cybercrime

THE GENERAL COUNSEL OF THE IAP ATTENDED THE EGMONT WORKING AND REGIONAL GROUP MEETING

The IAP General Counsel attended the Egmont Working and Regional Group Meetings in St Julian's, Malta, in January 2024. The IAP were granted observer status of the Egmont Group of Financial Intelligence Units in September 2023. She participated in the Technical Assistance and Training Working Group, giving a full presentation on the objectives of the IAP and the professional programme. The event was a useful opportunity to exchange best practice on the development and delivery of training programmes and initiatives, and also to discuss further collaboration with Egmont to build on the success of the two joint IAP-Egmont Group webinars that took place in December 2023.

IAP President Juan Bautista Mahiques attended the 31st General Meeting of the Ibero-American Association of Public Prosecutors (AIAMP), held in the city of Santiago, Chile, from 01-02 February 2024. President Mahiques, who was invited to represent the IAP as an observer, took the floor to highlight the evolving role of prosecutors' associations such as IAP and AIAMP. He pointed out that these organisations have become indispensable instruments of cooperation for prosecution services around the world, providing faster and more direct communication channels among colleagues.

The President also stressed the need to create training programmes specifically designed to meet the unique needs of the region. Such educational initiatives are essential to equip legal professionals with the skills and knowledge necessary to address the specific challenges they face in their jurisdictions. IAP and AIAMP offer an exceptional platform to accomplish this objective. The event served as a platform to celebrate the strategic partnership between the IAP and the AIAMP, which was recently cemented by the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding. This agreement marked a commitment to continued collaboration between the IAP and AIAMP, enabling a future of shared knowledge and mutual support between both associations.


THE 30TH ANNUAL CONFERENCE AND GENERAL MEETING OF THE IAP, SINGAPORE 2025

CELEBRATING 25 YEARS OF THE IAP STANDARDS

The IAP Standards of Professional Responsibility and Statement of the Essential Duties and Rights of Prosecutors ("the Standards").

The International Association of Prosecutors (IAP) was established in 1995 as the first global network of prosecutors. One of the most important objectives of the IAP is to 'promote and enhance those standards and principles which are generally recognised internationally as necessary for the proper and independent prosecution of offences'. In support of that objective, the IAP Standards of Professional Responsibility and Statement of the Essential Duties and Rights of Prosecutors ('the IAP Standards') were developed and adopted by the IAP in April 1999. The IAP Standards serve as an international benchmark for the conduct of individual prosecutors and of prosecution services. They are designed to be a working document that prosecuting authorities can use to develop their own standards of practice. The IAP Standards were endorsed by the United Nations Commission on Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice in 2008, and Member States were invited to encourage their prosecution services to take the both the UN Guidelines and the IAP Standards into consideration when reviewing or developing rules for prosecutorial conduct in their own countries. Notwithstanding the different legal systems and traditions around the world, the IAP Standards are of general applicability to all prosecutors as they carry out their functions.

The IAP Standards recognise that prosecutors play a crucial role in the administration of justice. They highlight standards of professional conduct that prosecutors must adhere to, including the need to be consistent, independent, impartial, to protect and serve the public interest and to protect the rights of the accused to a fair trial. They outline the role and duties of prosecutors in criminal proceedings, and underscore the need for prosecutors to cooperate with other national or international actors in the criminal justice sphere to ensure the fairness and effectiveness of prosecutions. They also require prosecutors to render assistance to the prosecution services of other jurisdictions in accordance with the law and in a spirit of mutual cooperation – highlighting the importance of international collaboration. Finally, the IAP Standards also stress that prosecutors should be protected against arbitrary action by governments and that they are entitled to carry out their professional functions without intimidation, hindrance, harassment or improper interference.

The Standards are now twenty-five years old. However, the principles that are outlined in them - independence, impartiality, integrity and the upholding of the rule of law - are as relevant to the role of a prosecutor nowadays as they were when they were first devised.


